Eruba Primary School is a government aided school located in Arua District, Northern Uganda and has 1,037 students (479 boys and 558 girls) from P1 to P7. The school has only 7 classrooms which are overcrowded with average number of 148 students in each class. In addition, P1 and P2 students have to sit on the floor while they are taking classes because their classrooms are not furnished with desks and chairs. Furthermore, there are only 5 stances of latrines each for girls and boys. Therefore, this project will construct a classroom block (4 class rooms) and boys' and girls' latrine blocks (5 stances each) and procure 108 three seater desks and furniture for teachers to provide the students with a better learning environment.

The Ambassador of Japan to Uganda, H. E. Junzo Fujita, signed the Grant Contract with Mr. Odama Godfrey, Head Teacher of Eruba Primary School and Unit for the Deaf, on 17 March 2015 at the Embassy of Japan.
