Namasale Seed Secondary School, located in Namasale Subcounty, Amolatar District, was established in 2007 through Universal Secondary Education (USE). The school is the only secondary school in the subcounty, which now has 83 girl students and 226 boy students from S1 to S6. The construction of a ferry port in 2012 has negatively affected the safety of the area because of the increasing coming and going of strangers. Girl students in particular are most affected by the changing environment by being harassed by men on their way to school and home. While some students rent huts in the slums near the ferry port, some other students walk up to 10km to get to the school. This project will construct a girls' dormitory in order to reduce the risks of dangerous commuting and provide a better learning environment.

The Ambassador of Japan to Uganda, H. E. Junzo Fujita, signed the Grant Contract with Ms. Rebecca Bisaso, Head Teacher of Namasale Seed Secondary School, on 17 March 2015 at the Embassy of Japan.
