Ashinaga Uganda, located in Wakiso District, Central Uganda, was established in 2001 as a local NGO by a Japanese philanthropic organisation Ashinaga Ikueikai. The NGO constructed their main office called "Rainbow House" in 2003 in Nansana Town of Wakiso District and has given education and counselling to HIV orphans through various programmes. In addition, the NGO started a new project titled "100 Year Vision Project: Educational Support for Orphaned Students from Sub-Saharan Africa" and constructed "Kokorojuku" (meaning "spirit house" in Japanese) for that purpose. This project aims at giving an intensive 6 month training to 35 students from 35 different Sub Saharan African countries and supporting them to go to highly ranked universities around the world. However, these facilities are not fully utilized due to unstable power and water supply. Therefore, this project will support their projects by installing two sets of a solar PV system and a solar water pump system.
