Buhweju Disctrict is located in the mountainous South Western Uganda where many community residents suffer from water shortage due to lack of access to underground water. Currently, the only source of water is nearby swamps which they share with domestic and wild animals. Fetching water is usually done by women and children; and in most cases, women have to leave home before sunrise which exposes them to many risks on the way. In most of the schools in the community, pupils go to fetch water in the morning and during lunch break negatively affecting their academic performance, and the access to the water source is limited. Moreover, pupils hardly have access to drinking water while at school since the little that is available is consumed by teachers. This project will install 20 rain water harvesting tanks in 20 primary schools in 3 sub counties and 1 town where access to safe and clean water will be increased, and water and sanitation environment for students and community residents will be improved.
