Bezza Al-Hijji Senior Secondary School is a community school located in Adjumani District, Northern Uganda, and is a learning centre to 252 boy students and 86 girl students from S1 to S4 and 21 teachers. The school currently uses a standard classroom as a science laboratory, which hardly meets the government's safety standard. Since there is no store for science equipment and chemicals, they are all stored under tables in the laboratory. Furthermore, the space of the existing laboratory is only enough to accommodate 21 students at once in spite of the fact that the average number of students in a class is 84, which forces a class to be divided into three groups and use the laboratory in shifts. Therefore, this project will construct a science laboratory block which has three rooms for chemistry, biology and physics, and also procure furniture in order to improve students' learning environment.

2. Grant Contract Ceremony

The Ambassador of Japan to Uganda, H. E. Junzo Fujita, signed the grant contract with Ms. Keliki Josephine Mama, Head Teacher of Bezza Al-Hijji Senior Secondary School, on 27 January 2016 at the Embassy of Japan.
