Childcare Padibe Primary School, located in Lamwo District, Northern Uganda, was established with the support of Irene Gleeson Foundation in 2007 and was registered as a government aided school in 2010. The school is now home to 773 students from P1 to P7 and 20 teachers. The existing classrooms are temporal structures without windows which were constructed within an internally displaced persons' camp in 2005 amidst of the war. They are now old and ram shackled. Their lessons are often disrupted by medium or heavy rain. Whenever it rains, lessons stop as pupils gather at the corners of their classrooms. Moreover, classrooms for P1 to P4 do not have desks and chairs so students are forced to sit on the floors to study. Therefore, this project will construct two classroom blocks and a latrine block, and also procure furniture in order to improve students' learning environment.
