

AMBASSADOR'S MESSAGE

APRIL 2018

Plenty of rain has been falling in Kampala as we are in the middle of the rainy season. This blessed rain will hopefully bring good agricultural harvest some time later. Later this April, I had opportunities to announce new contributions to Uganda's infrastructure and health sectors as well as assistance to refugees and local communities hosting them as you can read as below. I wish these inputs by Japan will facilitate Uganda's economic growth as well as adequately address acute needs of the people in difficulties.



EVENTS IN APRIL 4月の行事

12 April: Uganda Gateball Union Received Gear from Japan

World Gateball Union (Japan Gateball Union) donated their gateball equipment to Uganda to support their activities. 112 gateball sticks, 400 balls, and other items were handed over to Uganda Gateball Union by Ambassador Kameda. Gateball was devised in Japan in 1947 as a sports for all ages. More than 10 million people over 40 countries enjoy this sports.



17 April: 6 m. USD for Refugees and Host-communities Contributed

Minister of Disaster and Refugees, Hon. Onek and Ambassador together with Resident Coordinator, Ms. Malango and the Representatives of the UN agencies (UNHCR, WFP, UNDP, FAO) jointly held a press conference to announce Japan's new contributions through the agencies to support refugees and refugee-hosting communities in Uganda. The UN agencies will work in various areas including health, nutrition, protection, and livelihood.



21 April: Japanese Community Raised Funds for Baseball Association

Around 60 Japanese residents in Uganda gathered at the fundraising softball event for the Uganda Baseball Association which wishes to represent Africa at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. This event was held at the Japan Uganda National Friendship Stadium, Gayaza, which was constructed by the Government of Japan in 2014. 448 USD raised through the event will be used to maintain the stadium.



24 & 25 April: Amb. Osuga Paid Courtesy on President

Amb. Takeshi OSUGA, Director General of African Affairs Department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, paid a courtesy call on H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni . Amb. Osuga is the highest ranking technical officer at MOFA who designs Japan's policy on Africa including TICAD. He presented to the President the current preparation work towards the forthcoming TICAV 7 and requested the same support given by the President to the past TICAD processes.



26 April: Signing Ceremony for New Projects was Held.

Ambassador Kameda signed the Exchange of Notes for three projects with Hon. Kasaija Minister of Finance at MoFPED. These projects will contribute to improvements in health service access and quality in Northern Uganda, to better power conditions in Kampala and support international corridor infrastructure. 26 April: Japanese NGO Handed over a New School Building in Yumbe & UNDP's project funded by Japan launched.



A hand-over ceremony of a new Yangani Primary School building in Zone 5 in Bidibidi settlement was held by Association for Aid and Relief Japan (AAR Japan). Mr. Horii, Deputy Head of Mission attended the ceremony to celebrate the occasion. The Japanese NGO has been supporting the refugees and host communities in Bidibidi settlement since 2016. Together with AAR, another Japanese NGO, Peace Winds Japan also supports the school by providing WASH

training and facilities. The new school building will benefit close to 4,000 refugee and host community students currently enrolled at the school. On the same day, the project launch meeting was held in Yumbe for a UNDP's project funded by Japan. They'll provide emergency cash for work employment and support local governments' capacity building in Moyo, Yumbe, and Arua.




27 April: The New Nile Bridge Girder Closure Ceremony Held in Jinja

Ambassador Kameda, together with Hon. Azuba, Minister of Works and Transport, cerebrated the completion of center closure of the New Nile Bridge, hosted by Uganda National Roads Authority (UNRA) in Jinja District. They plan to complete substantial works by end of August this year and expect to commission this beautiful new bridge very soon.

UGANDA RECEIVES TWO NEW JAPANESE VOLUNTEERS

The beginning of April 2018, Two (2) Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCVs) started their activities in Uganda. Mr. Iwata Nobuto is teaching market-oriented horticulture at Masulita Vocational Institute in Wakiso. Mr. Matsuda Naohiro is conducting Rice Sensory Test at National Crops Resources Research Institute (NaCRRI) to promote rice production. Currently, 65 JOCV members are in the country.

Since the beginning of this program in Uganda in 2001, a total of 719 Japanese Volunteers have been dispatched to the country.

NEW NILE BRIDGE UPDATE

After more than 4 years since it was commissioned, construction on the New Nile Bridge is soon coming to completion. Currently, less than 5meters of the final segment of the bridge deck are being worked on and the centre closure of this whole section which spans 525 meters will finally be attained on 27th April, 2018. With this milestone achieved, the bridge will be as good as complete. Auxiliary works on the structure will continue as well as construction of access roads to this iconic bridge from both Njeru and Jinja sides.


THE MAIN BUILDING is designed by a Japanese architect Ikko Kobayashi. He maximized the potential of Ugandan local materials such as eucalyptus for the structure, baked bricks for the walls, and thatching grasses for the roof. Though the finishing is modern and stylish, at the same time you can feel relaxed as if you were in a village home.





AT THE RESTAURANT, the head chef Yoshifumi Yamaguchi and well-trained staffs will provide unique cuisine experiences with relaxing ambience and original Japanese-African fusion dishes. The quality ingredients used for the dishes are supplied by local farmers and from the demonstration garden where the company agriculture department is providing young community leaders with technical trainings.

THE VEGETABLES GROWN in the demonstration garden are also available through the door-to-door delivery service and at the shop opening in Tank Hill Park. Agriculture department also develops agri-products and exports them to Japan.
