


EVENTS IN JANUARY

JAN. 9: FOUR NEW GGP PROJECTS SIGNED

Ambassador Kameda signed four (4) grant contracts on 9th January at the Embassy of Japan, for the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP), totaling over 1.4 billion Uganda shillings (US\$ 404,076) with representatives of the recipient organizations. The new projects will be implemented in Serere, Arua, Kamuli, and Gulu district.

Our commitments in Uganda have successfully improved millions of people's lives through the construction of boreholes, class rooms, boys' and girls' dormitories, maternity wards and infectious disease wards, and the procurement of ambulances, school buses and trucks. With the four new projects signed, the number of projects implemented in Uganda through GGP will reach 239.







JAN. 22-24: JAPANESE CABINET SECRETARIAT VISIT

The Japanese Government dispatched a delegation of the Cabinet Secretariat to Kampala to have a series of discussions with relevant authorities including Hon. Minister of Health Dr. Aceng. The purpose of this visit was to prepare for the upcoming TICAD7 conference in August this year in Tokyo, as Japan is aiming to launch a new initiative in the health sector.



JAN. 24: JAPANESE NGO SIGNED A GRANT CONTRACT & LAUNCHING CEREMONY HELD

Ambassador Kameda signed a grant contract with Community Road Empowerment (CORE) for a project entitled, "Community Access Road Repair using Do-nou technology (wrapping soil in a gunny bag) through utilization of locally available materials and participatory approach by the youth (Phase 1)" on 24th January. The grant amount of 187,625 USD (approx. 700 million UGX) has been provided by the Government of Japan for the project. The launching ceremony took place at the same time of the signing a grant contract in Kamwokya.



The project aims to improve current conditions of community access roads through transferring the practical road maintenance methods of Do-nou technology and empower the youth groups in Central Kampala and multipurpose cooperative members in Wakiso District.

JAN. 25: JAPANESE NGO SIGNED A GRANT CONTRACT

Ambassador Kameda signed a grant contract with Terra Renaissance for a project entitled, "Self-resilience support for South Sudanese refugees and Host community — Vocational training and business setup support for vulnerable people — Phase II" on 25th January. The grant amount of 285,616 USD (approx. 1 billion UGX) has been provided by the Government of Japan for the project.

The project aims to support South Sudanese refugees and Host community to be self-reliant and enhance community stabilization and social development. The project provides vulnerable people of refugees and host community with vocational trainings and business setup support.

JAPANESE NGO WILL SIGN A GRANT CONTRACT & COMMISSIONING CEREMONY TO BE HELD

Ambassador Kameda will sign a grant contract with Save the Children Japan (SCJ) worth 567,985 USD (approx. 2 billion UGX) for a project entitled, "Project for Strengthening the Capacity of the Communities to Respond to Disasters and Adapt Climate Change for Vulnerable People in West Uganda (2nd Year)", for disaster risk reduction and preparedness in Kasese district.

The project aims at strengthening the Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR)/Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) capacity of vulnerable communities in Kasese District through the empowerment of the community DRR/CCA structure and support their activities to prepare for and respond to disasters, to mitigate the risk of disasters, and facilitate people to adapt to climate change.

KAMPALA FLYOVER GROUND BREAKING CEREMONY

19th December, 2018 will be forever etched in the history of Kampala; as the day when the construction of Kampala Flyover was inaugurated. The colorful function was attended by dignitaries of Uganda and Japan, including H.E. President Museveni. The only one of its kind in Uganda, this unique high quality infrastructure will solely be built with clear-cut Japanese technology whilst ensuring the highest quality of safety standards.

When completed, the project will add beauty to the skyline of Kampala making the city much more attractive. The travel time for motorists from the Ministry of Internal Affairs on Jinja road to Queensway will be shortened to around 5 to 7 minutes as opposed to the current 30-45minutes and motorists will be able to drive at 50km/hr across this project compared to current city driving speeds of 14km/hr. In addition, pedestrians will be able to walk and cross safely with ease.

At a cost of JPY19.989 billion (approx. \$180million), the project funded by JICA will be implemented by Shimizu-Konoike Joint venture.

SHIMIZU-KONOIKE JOINT VENTURE

Shimizu-Konoike Joint Venture has been engaged as the Contractor for Kampala Flyover Construction and Road Upgrading Project: Lot-1 (Package 1: Clock Tower Flyover & Package 2: Nsambya – Mukwano Road) implemented by the Uganda National Roads Authority (UNRA).

Shimizu Corporation, which is one of the major General Contractors in Japan, and Konoike

Construction, which has a long working experience in Uganda, constituted the Joint Venture for this project to deliver "Quality Infrastructure".

This project is a part of the UNRA's mission "to develop and maintain a national road network responsive to the economic needs of Uganda, for the safety of all users, and to environmental sustainability of the national roads corridors".



The objectives of the project are to mitigate traffic congestion and facilitate urban transpor-

tation in Kampala City, through construction of flyovers, widening of the roads and improvement of junctions in Kampala city, thereby contributing to the sustainable economic and social development of Uganda, as well as vitalization of logistics and transport to and from the neighboring countries.

On 19th December 2018, the ground breaking ceremony was held, officiated by the President H.E. Yoweri Museveni.



Shimizu-Konoike JV will implement this project with motto "Three-Way Satisfaction", which means that what benefits you, should ultimately also benefit your partners and the society to contribute further to the development of Uganda.
