New Classroom Block, Sanitation Facilities and School Furniture Delivered to Kyangwali Refugee Settlement with Support from Japan

The Embassy of Japan commissioned the newly constructed classroom block at Bukinda Primary School in Kyangwali Refugee Settlement, Kikuube District on Thursday 10th September 2026. The project, formally titled “The Project for the Construction of a Classroom Block at Bukinda Primary School in Kyangwali Refugee Settlement, Kikuube District”, was signed on 4th November 2025, with a grant of USD 122,999 from the Embassy of Japan, equating to over 418 million Ug. Shs.

The Deputy Ambassador of the Embassy of Japan to Uganda, Mr. YOSHIDA Norimasa officiated the commissioning of the project to the beneficiaries.

The details of the new project is as follows:

Action Against Hunger (ACF) is an international NGO founded in 1979, focusing on prevention, detection, and treatment of malnutrition, especially among children. In Uganda, ACF has responded to famine, protracted crisis, and refugee influxes for over 40 years, by working with families’ communities, governments, and partners to improve overall health and nutrition, address food insecurity, and build community resilience. Partnering with Bukinda Primary School in Kyangwali Refugee Settlement, Kikuube District, ACF constructed one classroom block, one 995m-long fence, two latrine blocks, and supply school furniture under this project. The project aimed to reduce pupil overcrowding in the classrooms and strengthen the sanitary environment at Bukinda Primary School.

The support is part of the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP), a scheme administered by the Embassy of Japan to support community-led development projects which uplift the life of people at the grassroots level. So far, a total of 296 projects have been funded under the scheme since its initiation in Uganda in 1992.
