Japan Supports to improve the education environment in Kwania District

The Embassy of Japan commissioned newly constructed classroom blocks at Amorigoga Primary School in Kwania District on Friday 17th July 2026. The project, formally titled “The Project for the Construction of Classroom Blocks at Amorigoga Primary School in Kwania District”, was officially signed on 28th January 2026, with a grant of USD 99,134 from the Embassy of Japan, equating to over 330 million Ug. Shs.

The Deputy Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Uganda, Mr. YOSHIDA Norimasa officiated the commissioning of the project to the beneficiaries.

Amorigoga Primary School in Kwania District is a government aided school with 1,145 pupils. With a strong self-help initiative, the school and the community repaired dilapidated school structures in response to the increasing number of pupils. Nonetheless, this was not enough to cover for the increasing demand, making teachers and pupils difficult to conduct lessons properly. In response to these pressing needs, the Embassy of Japan supported the construction of two classroom blocks, two latrine blocks for girls, one latrine block for boys, and supply school furniture under this project. The project aims to reduce pupil overcrowding in the classrooms and strengthen the sanitary environment.

The support is part of the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP), a scheme administered by the Embassy of Japan to support community-led development projects which uplift the life of people at the grassroots level. So far, a total of 296 projects have been funded under the scheme since its initiation in Uganda in 1992.
